VFW POST 4667 AWARDED 2005 JENNIFER C. BYLER AWARD OF EXCELLENCE

Through the years, the Department of Charitable Gaming has recognized and honored qualified and permitted charitable gaming organizations in the Commonwealth of Virginia for their outstanding quality of service to both their organization and their community, and their efforts toward enhancing the image of charitable gaming. In addition, the Department also recognizes the outstanding social services provided by these organizations, and their ability to offer services to people and organizations in need – the true purpose of charitable giving. Of course, this goal could not be met without talented and committed people and members who volunteer their services and contribute enormously to their charitable causes.

On June 7, 2005, the Charitable Gaming Board recognized four charitable organizations with the 2005 Jennifer C. Byler Award of Excellence. Each of these organizations exhibited strong leadership and exercised solid fiscal control of its gaming operation. Audits and inspections conducted by the Department of Charitable Gaming found a high level of commitment by each organization in complying with state laws and regulations. VETERAN SERVICES

Annually, VFW service officers process thousands of veteran's claims, which have resulted in the recovery of hundreds of millions dollars in disability compensation claims for veterans. Service officers, who must pass rigorous testing and annual certification, also assist veterans in discharge upgrades, record corrections, education benefits and pension eligibility.

In addition, service officers regularly inspect VA health care facilities and national cemeteries, and employment specialists monitor laws concerning veterans' preference in federal employment.

The VFW also monitors medical and health issues affecting veterans as well as providing veterans with up-to-date information on diabetes, post-traumatic stress, Agent Orange exposure and Persian Gulf Syndrome.

To help veterans, the VFW Tactical Assessment Center is a 24-hour help line for veterans with questions or concerns about VA entitlements. (1-800-vfw-1899)

In order to ensure that only the names of U.S. military veterans are placed on the memorial, we are requiring verification that the person whose name is placed on the memorial is currently in or has *served honorably* in the U.S. military. *It is the responsibility of the person applying to provide an adequate form of verification so that eligibility can be determined*. Some examples of acceptable forms of verification are: DD-214 (Discharge papers), veteran's organization membership card (i.e. VFW, American Legion, etc.), photograph of service member in uniform with other service members, photo of service members name on a monument or memorial.

You must attach a form of eligibility to this application. Applications without a form of verification will not be processed.

All payments by check should be made out to "VFW Post 4667" and on the memo line please indicate "VFW Memorial".

Donations to help with the construction and maintenance of the memorial are welcomed. All donations to the project are tax deductible. You can indicate the amount of donation on the front of this form or mail your donation to the VFW. Please indicate on the check memo line "VFW Memorial Donation".


